The Minnesota winter travel basketball season is intended to be for community- and school-based teams. The winter basketball season runs from late October through the MYAS Grade State tournaments in March. The Player Transfer information contained in this document pertains to the winter/traveling season only. Please see the MYBA Team Composition Guidelines for complete information regarding team composition and eligibility.

Residency Exception Policies and Explanations

Athletes must try out and compete with the travel association within the community where they attend school, which is the athlete's Home Association. However, the Residency Exception is available to the players who meet the following criteria.

1. An athlete who lives within the boundaries of an association that does not border the association where they attend school may request a Residency Exception to allow them to participate with the association where they reside.
 - a. **Example:** This would allow a player who lives in the Stillwater high school attendance area and goes to a public school in Anoka to participate with Stillwater.
 1. Anoka and Stillwater do not share a border.
 2. The bordering association component is not in effect for this exception.
 3. Documentation from Anoka schools verifying the player resides in Stillwater must accompany the completed player's Residency Exception Form.
2. Limit of 1 Residency Exception player per team and the Residency Exception form must be completed annually.
3. The following Residency Verification Documents (listed below) must accompany the completed Residency Exception Form (Please note that the names on this form, the verification from the school and utility bill/housing statement must match):
 - a. Documentation from the school the player attends that verifies the address on file for the student.
 - b. A current utility bill or housing statement (cell phone bills will not be accepted).
4. The completed Residency Exception Form and all required Residency Verification Documents must be submitted to mybacompliance@myas.org no later than November 1, 2026.
